From Fertile Ground Art & Innovation

Art Concept and Proposal:

Emeryville, a city marked by the fusion of technology and nature, has undergone a remarkable transformation from its industrial past to its thriving present. My public art proposal, "From Fertile Ground Art and Innovation," aims to capture the city's spirit by presenting four fictional settings that reflect its unique essence. Approach:

Challenges:

A primary challenge is balancing abstraction and representation. While I wish to maintain creative freedom, honoring Emeryville's distinct identity is crucial. To achieve this, I have selected key references for each painting (e.g., mudflat artwork, overpasses, skylines, and rail lines) and included the many natural references to hint at our location. My daily walks around Emeryville have provided valuable observations and references from landmarks, wildlife, and native plants.

"From Fertile Ground Art and Innovation" captures the spirit of Emeryville by presenting fictional settings that showcase its unique blend of technology and nature. The artwork will invite viewers to explore the city s past, present, and future through visual storytelling, serving as a testament to the power of innovation and environmental resilience. From Fertile ground – Art and Innovation

April 14, 2023

Dear Emeryville Public Art Committee,

In the 12 years I have been working from my Emeryville studio I have been inspired by the ample biodiversity even within its small urban boundaries. On a recent walk, I was able to catalog at least 13 different California species that have been planted nearby.

My proposal is to create four unique collages incorporating native California plants. Plants are so important to humans and I want to highlight, celebrate and express gratitude for them and their foundational importance to the biotechnology being innovated all around us here. Previously, I chose to approach the Temporary Bus Shelter project with naturalistic watercolor paintings of local bird species combined with hand painted inspiring quotes relating to avian species. I am so grateful to have had to opportunity to share my love of Emeryville, nature, and art I I years ago and would be thrilled to undertake another project continuing sharing the local species with the public.

I have studied native plants for many years and have deepest respect for the intelligence of plant life and their essential and vital importance in our ecosystem. I have converted my own yard from invasive Bermuda grass and blackberries to over 50 species of native California shrubs, plants, and trees. I honor and respect the local Lisjan Ohlone people who lived in reciprocity with this entire ecosystem for so many thousands of years and continue to use our plant neighbors in their medicines and ceremonies.

The medium of collage itself is a fertile ground for experimentation, not bound by any one material. Much like the innovation that happens in the biotech companies so close to me, in my studio I merge materials from the earth with the human made. I employ ochre and sienna pigments sourced from the earth with quinacridones and phthalocyanines synthesized in labs. I mix paper from trees and cotton plants with nylon and synthetic textiles. From these materials I cut shapes inspired by botanical forms, rocks, moon, sun, and mountains to combine with the collected natural materials.

My art also reveals the unseen world – this fertile ground of energy and spirit from which the physical world springs forth. The inspired forms, shapes, textures seek not to imitate life but to and reveal patterns and relationships that extend beyond what our logical right brains can comprehend. Each artwork is a packet of understanding and knowledge to be uniquely decoded by the heart of the viewer, just as our DNA is a richly encoded structure from which our physical bodies are developed. The layering of transparent, translucent pours of acrylics with sheer or loosely woven textiles refers

to the depth of ways of perceiving and processing reality from the micro to the macro, from physical reality to the realms of consciousness.

Plant life is so essential to our well-being most essentially to our existence – they generously create the oxygen we breathe. Yet so few of us can identify the plants that surround us by name. We walk by an abundance of food and medicinal plants daily without realizing what they have to offer.

My intention is to not only pay homage to these important plants but to invite Emeryville residents, workers, and visitors to become more familiar with the local plants by naming them and highlighting them in these works. I hope to title the works with their Chochenyno names, thereby honoring not only the plant's significance but our gratitude to the original people of this land. My wish is share with others the joy and appreciation for the rich abundance that surrounds us each day.

Thank you for this opportunity and taking the time to hear my ideas.



Art Concept / Jess Cook
From Fertile Ground – Art and Innovation
Sharon Wilchar Temporary Art Bus Shelter Program

My inspiration for these artworks draws heavily on the natural world in flux, but also more provocatively, the pull between history and now and the wildly contrasting versions of our future that residents hold – the tensions between authenticity and purity and advancement and capital. Captivated by the potential of doing good by all - by the original inhabitants of this land - and generating good with the resources we have available. The art I create is meant to contribute to Emeryville being a landscape of curiosity and inquisitiveness: sparking interest through aesthetics.

Emotional Investment in Emeryville

As a part-time resident in Emeryville's marina, I watch my 4-year-old son's fascination and my own learning as we observe the seasons, the shifts, the injustice, the glory and direct human impact on the bay. The bluster and bruise of storms, the vibrancy of pelicans fishing overhead in the midst of a gale, the migrations of waterfowl, moonrise over the ridge, the ferries and commercial fishing boats announcing their return from sea, endless play in the parks, the red tide rise, the deluge of human waste overflow, the regal presence of herons, intermittent and ethereal found object artworks propped on the stone retaining walls, feeding crabs discovered by the light of a headlamp. As windsurfers and recreationists, my partner and I have traversed the bay waters between Emeryville and Berkeley countless times under all sorts of wind; we have biked on work commutes through Emeryville, swum in the community center pool, patronized Arizmendi bakery as devotees, completed projects while sipping at Peets, shared Peruvian food) and played at the whale playground at The Public Market. We have taken the Emery Go-Round (our son's first-ever bus experience) and public bus system and pointed out artworks – at the bus shelters, under the overpass, over doors and in plazas – as we moved throughout the city with our little one. This is a life that has harbored in the Emeryville Marina for over 8 years, critical years of creating partnership and growing a family. Contributing my own experiences and aesthetic to spaces in the city that encourage looking up and out at public transit stops would be providing a bit of myself in gratitude to the complexities of this place.

Artistic Evolution & Technique

As an artist I spent years with drawing and charcoal, which evolved into printmaking during my tenure at Clark University, then papercut, block printing, and photography for personal projects. After moving to Oakland in 2015 I rediscovered stencils, this time as it connects to street art traditions and social justice art traditions.

Now I hand cut stencils shaped by my own rendering style, and utilize water-based spray paint, enabling a layering of rich tones and high contrast. I have shared skills with children in art-making, photography, and mural-making, and now am a part-time art exploration partner to our four-year-old son. My spray stencil work predominantly draws inspiration from the natural world, as well as cultural references. I am currently drawn to site-specific botanicals with unique histories and living stories to tell. My works have been featured on the walls of a collective children's space in a historic Barcelona mill building, a two-story fanciful treehouse in Napa, and in interior decor for private homes.

Concept Piece 1: Skeletons as Structure

With prolific aquatic life as inspiration, this piece plays with the idea that paying attention to nature and history will be our salvation in a rapidly changing world - that even our technology gains dramatically when mimicking biological mechanisms. Crustacean exoskeletons (as well as those of insects and mycelium) provide a sugar compound called chitosan, which has endless possible uses - with the ability to transfer kinetic to electrical energy, enable medical devices, and create alternative fabrics. The backdrop of the Ohlone Emeryville shellmound reminds us to honor and learn from history, and make just space for living traditions - through which we can learn to care for the earth and for community.

Concept Piece 2: Red Tide

A microscopic look at the red tide algae, Heterosigma akashiwo, alongside a life-size rendering of the ancient bay-dweller sturgeon, leads us to question the connection, and maybe find moments of beauty and hope amidst tragedy.

Concept Piece 3: Ephemerality

In the tide zone everything is ephemeral: shifting with the tides, the seasons, the storms. The mudflats and scrub brush provide a critical ecosystem function - filtering, cleaning at the interface of ocean/bay and convergence of land and watershed. Their shift and gifts also continuously provide inspiration to makers, puttering with found objects washed ashore, casual architects, and artists with a larger vision. The driftwood art movement in the Emeryville mudflats documented in the 60's and 70's and continued today along different parts of the Emeryville shoreline give way to a background of freeway crisscrossing and Oakland's wastewater treatment plant.

Concept Piece 4: Filter

This piece draws on the power of microorganisms and natural processes to provide essential filtering and cleaning services along Emeryvilles coastline, illuminating the macro effect of individual micro in nature, questions of water quality and waste, and the essential wonder of nature in its details.










My paintings investigate overlooked moments of my everyday surroundings. I am drawn to the relationship between natural and humanmade forms and use snapshots from my daily walks as reference. Fences, gates, and windows often become framing devices that natural elements either have to negotiate or sit comfortably within. Saturated colors, patterns and textures create dense images which incorporate light and shadow as graphic elements. The paintings ultimately become studies of the formal issues of color, pattern, and composition.


I work in Emeryville and often go on walks throughout the city on my lunchbreak. I've made paintings and drawings from the things I see in Emeryville. I plan to make paintings and drawings that use Emeryville as inspiration that invite the viewer to take a closer look at the quiet moments in their immediate surroundings.

Lisa Rock is an artist born in Massachusetts who lives and paints in Oakland. She received her MFA in Studio Art from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas and her BFA in Painting from the Rhode Island School of Design. PROPOSAL Submitted by Grégoire Vion



1 - Intent and Approach – Connections

As a life-long creative and innovator, I've always thought of the city – with its intricate physical and social features and configuration, and its wonderfully inhabitants— as an especially fertile ground. And I am also fascinated by the natural world, but in my mind, these two realms are not so distant; I see effervescence, and wonder equally in both realms, and especially beauty in connections, in how we travel back and forth between culture and nature, the physical and the intangible.

My paintings are most often improvised - I first apply color to the canvas in broad spontaneous strokes, let shapes and hues fall where they may. Then I consider this first, lose level of expression and begin to outline with white paint the areas that seem particularly promising, and with the same white pigment, blank out what seems inert, but of course these white fields - the in-betweeness – take a life or their own, and I observe that carefully as well, shaping and refining emptiness as much as what is full. Meaning begins to arise, in the positive and negative forms, and true joy comes from seeing the harmony rise through it all. My work is all about connectivity, about finding beauty in all beings and things, and very much in the space between things.

My career as painter is preceded by 30 years as graphic designer; in that capacity I have often worked with scientists (and again as recently as last month, as it happens), in conversation with them creating images that help support their research and represent the essence of it in a concise, accessible manner. My art studio in Emeryville is surrounded by biotech companies, this theme of Fertile Ground you propose is an invitation I cannot resist.

2 - Resume

Born in Ermont, France, Grégoire Vion earned a Master's degree in product design from the Ecole Supérieure de Design Industriel in Paris.

Grégoire's graphic work has garnered numerous awards and has been featured in Print, How, Communication Arts and other graphic trade publications and books, also in exhibitions at the Yerba Buena Center for the Arts of San Francisco and the Massachusetts College of Art and Design. He has taught Corporate Identity Design at the Academy of Art University in San Francisco. He provides consulting and art direction services in design and illustration to a broad clientele; from local food retail to international biotech, print and multimedia publishing, institutions, consumer-goods, health care, and more.

In 2012, Grégoire began shifting the core of his activity from commercial graphic design to fine arts, working mostly in soft pastel on paper and more recently in acrylic on canvas. He works as a full-time artist in Emeryville, at the Compound Studios in Emeryville.

3 - Paintings

The paintings shown in this presentation were produced before I was informed of your current RFP, but they have never been sold or exhibited in public and I would be very pleased if you found them applicable for your program. I am also happy to create entirely new pieces for you; since my artistic process involves improvisation, I am reticent to sketch out specifically what that would be, but these images (including the one shown on the cover of this document) give you a good sense of the general look and feel of what I can create at your request.



3a - Paintings

I like to paint the convergence of culture and nature, and often depict scenes or beings where what is natural converses or even merges with what is manufactured. The general aesthetic is urban, but the details are full of life and growth and intriguing connections.



3b - Paintings

A seed in the ground, and then growth upward, and from there flying beyond.

A world of pliable surfaces, self-organizing and expanding.

This one is on one level about music (see the keyboard evoked on the left) but more generally about energy, a cultural world alive with of vibrations at all scales.





Letter of Interest:

I am excited to submit my proposal for the Emeryville Art in Public Places Program. As an artist who has lived and worked in Emeryville for over a decade, I am passionate about creating art that celebrates the community and connects people through the surprise and delight of color.

My proposal, "Local Color," features four unique designs for the four different bus routes in Emeryville. Each design features an individual color palette inspired by the surrounding environment. Each bus route's design will be unique and reflective of the particular surroundings it passes through. For example, the color palette for the route that passes by the Bay Street shopping center could incorporate the colors of the storefronts and signage, while the palette for the route that goes by the Emeryville marina could incorporate the colors of the water and local flora and fauna. This approach will create a sense of cohesion and recognition for each route, while also highlighting the distinctive characteristics of each area with the goal of encouraging viewers to notice and appreciate the beauty of their surroundings.


Studies have shown that the practice of noticing our environment and its colors can have a positive impact on our mental health and promote overall well-being. By incorporating intentional color choices into public spaces, we can create environments that promote positive emotional and physical health for all members of the community. As an artist with a background in letterpress and color matching, I have a deep appreciation for the psychological impact of color and its ability to create connections between people and their environment. I am including general mockups of the designs, though if selected, I will walk each bus route to identify the specific colors that passengers may see along the route.

By exploring Emeryville through the lens of color, I am able to showcase the diverse elements that make up the city. It is a dynamic amalgamation of big-box stores, biotech companies, artist studios, and breathtaking natural scenery. As an artist committed to human connection, community building, and color, I am confident that my proposal embodies the core pillars of my work while also celebrating the fertile ground of Emeryville. Additionally, by encouraging viewers to notice and appreciate the beauty of their surroundings, my proposal creates opportunities for individuals to feel a deeper connection to the city and natural surroundings.

Overall, I am thrilled about the opportunity to contribute to the Emeryville Art in Public Places Program and to create art that reflects the vibrancy and diversity of our little city. I am confident that my experience and passion for color will allow me to create a series of designs that will engage and delight all who pass through Emeryville. Thank you for considering my proposal.

Preliminary Images

Option 1 - Color block swatches. These are sample layouts pulled from a mural I painted with the same concept. I would provide a digital file once I compile the colors of Emeryville.



Option 2 - Airbrush spots. Examples of a painting series that I've done but could be translated to this concept. I would create the paintings based on the matched colors and the paintings would be photographed.







Bio + Experience:

I am an accomplished letterpress printer and emerging artist based in Emeryville, CA with over 13 years of industry experience. Throughout my career, I have focused on creating unique artist books and editions, working alongside bookbinders and other letterpress printers. In fact, I co-founded Western Editions, a letterpress studio that specialized in custom design and small-batch printing while also producing artist prints and curating gallery shows with my co-founder for seven years.

In 2019, I shifted my focus to prioritize my personal studio practice and began creating work that celebrates the power of color, human connection, and experimentation. Along the way, I have collaborated with a diverse range of commercial brands like Hush Puppies and Allbirds, have created work for offices like Square HQ and the Google Artist in Residence program, and have printed colophons and text for several artist editions, including renowned names such as Maira Kalman, Clare Rojas, Malick Sidiblé, and Wayne Thiebaud.

As a professional artist, I excel at creating public art that engages the community through social practice. For instance, at the Jewish Community Center, I curated a letterpress print and paint station as part of the Stern Grove Festival. Visitors were encouraged to create postcards while taking a moment to reflect and write thoughtful notes. My approach included stamps and a mailbox for easy mailing to remove that barrier. Another example of my work in public art with a social practice element has been with the San Francisco Ferry Building for two years in a row in 2021 and 2022, coinciding with Earth Day. I was commissioned to create a piece that enlivened and filled the space after vendors left due to Covid. In 2021, I gathered responses from the community answering the question "How are you an ally to Earth?" and letterpressed these responses into a colorful array spanning 88 feet. Utilizing this same concept in 2022, I worked with local shops and vendors at the Ferry Building to share their sustainability practices to fill the hallway. Through these projects, I have developed a deep understanding of how to create public art that is not only visually striking but also encourages community engagement and social change.

My largest solo exhibition to date, <u>The Sensation of Color</u>, recently debuted at Bedford Gallery in Walnut Creek in January, where I filled the spacious 3500 square foot gallery with prints, paintings, and two large-scale site-specific installations, all centered around the ways in which color impacts our daily lives often in subconscious ways. Building on this exploration of color and my appreciation of nature, my proposal for the Emeryville Bus Shelter draws from my daily walking practice, which has honed my ability to notice the colors and details of my surroundings. As an artist with a background in color matching, I am uniquely positioned to create a shelter that not only serves its functional purpose but

also acts as a beautiful and thought-provoking piece of public art. I have already successfully executed a similar project in 2022, when I was commissioned to paint a 40' mural at the bustling corner of Hayes Street and Divisadero in my former neighborhood. Using my walks around the area as inspiration, I carefully matched 27 colors that reflect the vibrant hues found in the surrounding environment. I believe that my experience in this type of public art makes me the ideal candidate for this project and I am excited to bring my vision to the Emeryville community.

Letter of Interest

I have lived in Emeryville on the Bay in Watergate condos for fifteen years since our move from Pennsylvania. I discovered this refuge, this little heaven, peaceful and inspiring sanctuary right here in the crowded East Bay, closest to San Francisco city. Emeryville Marina has been a constant source of inspiration for me and my creativity. I walk along the Bay every morning and rejoice in the movement and energy of waves, clouds, birds, plants, and trees. Since the very beginning of this year, we have seen severe weather and heavy winds and rains that have ravaged many of the Marina trees who have been my constant companions for the last 15 years. I felt very saddened and shocked and was reminded of the Creek and Diablo range wildfires in 2020 in which the Emeryville Marina experienced orange smoke in the air. I can't forget the eerie feeling that morning as I went for the walk despite the bad air quality. It was painful when I saw the red sun and deep orange atmosphere. I took pictures of the trees of Marina as they appeared black against orange. I returned home and did several sketches of these trees and charcoal. Looking at these drawings I feel closure now that at least I have preserved the images of those trees which are lost to us forever. However, the Bay is always an area of hope and inspiration for me. The birds come and gather on the rocks and take the wing and fly in murmuration. As they fly in formations, I see them appear and as they turn, now I do not see them. Watching the dance of the waves and the birds gives me hope and the pleasure of living in Emeryville. I am always inspired and have written poems and created paintings to remember them.

Following are two poems which express my two themes in this proposal-

O Tree

When I saw you in that fiery orange light

You appeared as black burnt wood

Wildfires are burning your sisters

Were you mourning?

Sun is behind the layer of orange

Smoke has filled the air

I want to save you

Neither push to go in front of another


Like waves they swirl above the waters

Salma Arastu

Painter, sculptor, poet

As an internationally exhibited woman artist I bring a unique global perspective due to the fact that I was born into the Sindhi and Hindu traditions in Rajasthan, India, and later embraced Islam and moved to USA in 1986. As a woman, artist, and mother, I work to create harmony by expressing the universality of humanity through paintings, sculpture, calligraphy and poetry. Inspired by the imagery, sculpture and writings of my Indian heritage and Islamic spirituality, I use my artistic voice to break down the barriers that divide to foster peace and understanding. At birth I was given the life-defining challenge of a left hand without fingers. Seeing the unity of an all-encompassing God, I was able to transcend the barriers often set-forth in the traditions of religion, culture, and the cultural perceptions of handicaps. My works are lyrical, spiritual, figurative, and calligraphic. I have tried to bring together Eastern spirituality and Western techniques of painting learned over the years. Through the contrasting elements in my work, I yearn and search for unity balance.


My works are greatly influenced by my studies and experiences in different cultures around the world. After graduating in Fine Arts from Maharaja Sayajirao University in Baroda, India, I lived and worked in Iran and Kuwait, where I was exposed to a wealth of Islamic arts and Arabic calligraphy. Calligraphy, miniatures, and the folk art of Islam and the Hindu tradition continue to influence my work today.

I was invited to Germany twice, first as a Resident Artist in 2000 at Schwabisch Gmund and again in the Spring of 2011, by the Westphalia Wilhelm University in Münster, Germany invited to publish my paper "Art Informed by Spirituality" in the publication on the International Symposium: 'God Loves Beauty: Post Modern Views on Religion and Art. I have presented my work and given talks at Stanford University, Commonwealth of San Francisco, Seattle University, Graduate Theological Union at Berkeley, and Museum of Contemporary Religious Art, St. Louis Missouri. I was invited to Morocco for a one-month Artist Residency Program in March of 2018 through Green Olives art Gallery.

As a visual artist I have had 45 solo shows nationally and internationally and have won several prestigious awards including the East Bay Community's Fund for Artists in 2012 and 2014 and 2020. The City of Berkeley's Individual Artist Grant Award in 2014, 2015, and 2016. I have public art pieces on display in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania and San Diego, California and I have also written and published five books on my art and poetry including my recent with ecological consciousness from Quranic verses "Our Earth: Embracing All Communities."






