SUBJECT: Community Advisory Committee Appointments FY2025-26

RECOMMENDATION

Staff presents this item for Council consideration without a recommendation. Appointments to Community Advisory Committees are made at the City Council's discretion. A separate Resolution will be approved for each set of Committee appointments.

BACKGROUND

The City Council appoints community members to serve on the City's various Community Advisory Committees ("Committees"). Committees are an opportunity for community members to have input on specific programs and initiatives of the City. All Committee meetings are publicly noticed, and the public is encouraged to attend. Actions taken by Committees are forwarded to the full City Council for consideration and possible action, with the exception of the Planning Commission and Housing Advisory and Appeals Board, which have some independent authority, and some of their decisions are subject to City Council review or appeal.

The Committees consist of a wide range of community members representing specific demographics. Below are definitions of the various existing committee positions. It is not uncommon to receive an application from a candidate that fulfills the qualifications for multiple committee positions. When that occurs, the applicants are listed in all relevant categories for consideration per Committee.

Business Representative	Person representing a business in Emeryville of any size.
City Labor Representative	Person representing a labor union with members represented in Emeryville.
Community Member	Person residing or working in Emeryville.
Large Business Representative	Person representing a business in Emeryville with over 56 employees.
Non-Profit Workforce Development Organization Representative	Person representing a local non-profit workforce development organization.
Resident	Person residing in Emeryville.
Resident (94608)	Person residing within the Emeryville- Oakland 94608 zip code.
Small Business Representative	Person representing a business in Emeryville with 55 or less employees.

DISCUSSION

There are upcoming vacancies on all Committees for terms scheduled to expire June 30, 2025. The City Clerk's Office opened the annual recruitment on April 4, 2025, with an application deadline of May 19, 2025.

Notice of the vacancies was posted on the City's three bulletin boards. In addition, the City Clerk's Office included notice of these vacancies on the City's website, social media sites, ETV Cable Channel 27, and made announcements at City Council meetings. Committee secretaries were also encouraged to distribute the Notice of Vacancies to their committee members and members of the public. Staff reached out to incumbents to determine whether they had continued interest in serving on their committees.

The City Clerk's Office received several applications for the various vacancies from interested community members. Staff has also encouraged and provided information to applicants to attend the June 17, 2025, special City Council meeting.

A comprehensive listing of all vacancies and qualified applicants is attached to the staff report as **Attachment A**.

Bicycle / Pedestrian Advisory Committee

The Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee consists of up to nine (9) total members. The Committee's purpose is to provide input and recommendations regarding City policies, priorities and feedback related to the City's Bicycle/Pedestrian Plan and related initiatives.

This Committee has 1 Business Representative or Community Member position, and 3 Community Member positions that are scheduled to end June 30, 2025. Committee member terms are for two years.

Budget Advisory Committee

The Budget Advisory Committee consists of up to five (5) total members. The Committee's purpose is to provide input and recommendations regarding City policies, priorities and feedback related to the City's budget.

This Committee has 1 Business Representative position, and 1 City Labor Representative position that are scheduled to end June 30, 2025. Committee member terms are for two years.

Commission on Aging

The Commission on Aging consists of up to seven (7) total members. The Committee's purpose is to provide input and recommendations regarding City policies, priorities and feedback related to the health and wellness of seniors in the community.

This Committee has 1 Community Member position, and 2 Resident positions that are scheduled to end June 30, 2025. Committee member terms are for two years.

Economic Development Advisory Committee

The Economic Development Advisory Committee consists of up to nine (9) total members. The Committee's purpose is to provide input and recommendations regarding City policies and priorities related to the City's economic development priorities and strategies.

This Committee has 1 Large Business Representative/Business Representative position currently vacant; and 1 Resident, and 2 Small Business Representative positions that are scheduled to end June 30, 2025. Committee member terms are for two years.

Housing Committee

The Housing Committee consists of up to seven (7) total members. The Committee's purpose is to provide input and recommendation regarding City policies, priorities, and feedback related to the City's housing policies and programs.

This Committee has 3 Community Member positions that are scheduled to end June 30, 2025. Committee member terms are for two years.

No applications were received for this Committee during the annual recruitment process.

Parks and Recreation Committee

The Parks and Recreation Committee consists of up to seven (7) total members. The Committee's purpose is to provide input and recommendations regarding City policies, priorities, and feedback related to the City's recreation programs, cultural events and activities; public use of parks; development of new parks, and enhancements to existing parks and recreation facilities, as outlined in the Parks and Recreation Strategic Plan.

This Committee has 4 Community Member positions that are scheduled to end June 30, 2025. Committee member terms are for two years.

Public Art Committee

The Public Art Committee consists of up to nine (9) total members. The Committee's purpose is to provide input and recommendations regarding City policies, priorities, and feedback related to the City's Percent for Art Ordinance, and related matters. Pursuant to Emeryville Municipal Code Section 2-3.403, the "Public Art Committee membership shall be determined by resolution of the City Council". In addition, pursuant to Emeryville Municipal Code Section 2-3.404, "the terms of the Public Art Committee shall be staggered and for a period of two years, commencing July 1 of the year of appointment; except that the City Council shall appoint two of the initial members to the expanded nine-member Committee to three-year terms".

This Committee has 5 Business Representative or Resident positions that are scheduled to end June 30, 2025. Three of the Committee positions are for two-year terms; the remaining two positions are three-year terms.

ACTC Paratransit Advisory and Planning Committee

The Alameda County Transportation Commission's Paratransit Advisory and Planning Committee ("PAPCO") is a regional committee comprised of 23 residents throughout Alameda County. The Committee's purpose is to make recommendations to improve the planning and coordination of transportation services for seniors and people with disabilities in Alameda County.

Each year following City Council reorganization, the City Council appoints City representatives to various county, regional and statewide bodies ("regional bodies"). For some of these positions, the representative receives a stipend from the regional bodies as compensation for their attendance at meetings. The City Council thereby adopted Resolution No. 12-146:

"Resolution of the City Council of the City of Emeryville Relating to Appointment of Councilmembers to Compensated Positions and Directing the City Clerk to Post Form 806 as Required by FPPC Regulation 18705.5".

Accordingly, all Council Members may participate in a decision to appoint representatives to a compensated position. The City Clerk will subsequently amend and publicly notice the completed FPPC Form No. 806 on the City's website.

This Committee has 1 Resident position currently vacant. Committee terms are for two years.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no direct fiscal impact. Alameda County Transportation Commission does offer PAPCO members a stipend for meetings attended.

STAFF COMMUNICATION WITH THE PUBLIC

Staff has not had any communication with the public regarding these appointments, other than confirmation of received applications and advising applicants regarding the Advisory Body appointment process.
