Resolution Of The City Council Of The City Of Emeryville Authorizing The City Manager To Execute A First Amendment To The Maintenance Services Agreement With Precision Concrete Inc. To Increase The Total Compensation By \$208,000 For A Total Amount Not To Exceed \$253,000 For On-Call Sidewalk Survey And Repairs As Part Of The Sustainable Streetscapes Project (SUT-01) And To Extend The Contract Term To December 31, 2026

WHEREAS, the City entered into a Maintenance Contract (Agreement) with Precision Concrete Inc. (Contractor) on December 12, 2022; and

WHEREAS, under the Agreement, the Contractor determined specific locations on City sidewalks requiring trip hazard and ADA non-compliance repairs, but the scope did not include funding to conduct the repairs; and

WHEREAS, the City requires additional funding to conduct those repairs; and

WHEREAS, the City requires on-call maintenance service to conduct future spot-condition assessment and repairs of City sidewalk trip hazards and ADA non-compliance; and

WHEREAS, the cost to complete the spot repairs is \$108,000, and the cost to fund oncall services through December 31, 2026 is not to exceed \$100,000; and

WHEREAS, a First Amendment to the Agreement is needed to pay for the additional services; and

WHEREAS, there is adequate funding in the CIP within the Sustainable Streetscapes Project (SUT-01); therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Emeryville that the City Manager is authorized to execute a First Amendment to the Maintenance Contract with Precision Concrete Inc., attached hereto as Exhibit A, to increase the contract amount by \$208,000 to an amount not to exceed \$253,000 for On-Call Sidewalk Survey and Repairs and extend the contract term to December 31, 2026.

1.3 Total Compensation Amount

The Parties desire to increase the Total Compensation Amount as set forth in Section 1.3.C of the Contract by TWO HUNDRED EIGHT THOUSAND DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$208,000.00). The total amount paid under the Contract as compensation for Services performed and reimbursement for costs incurred shall not, in any case, exceed TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THREE DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$253,000.00).

2. CONTINUING EFFECT OF CONTRACT

Except as amended by this Amendment, all other provisions of the Contract remain in full force and effect and shall govern the actions of the Parties under this Amendment. From and after the date of this Amendment, whenever the term "Contract" appears in the Contract, it shall mean the Contract as amended by this Amendment.

3. ADEQUATE CONSIDERATION

The Parties hereto irrevocably stipulate and agree that they have each received adequate and independent consideration for the performance of the obligations they have undertaken pursuant to this Amendment.

4. SEVERABILITY

If any portion of this Amendment is declared invalid, illegal, or otherwise unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

5. WAIVER

The City's failure to enforce any provision of this Amendment or the waiver in a particular instance shall not be construed as a general waiver of any future breach or default.

PROPOSAL FOR "NOT TO EXCEED" AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF EMERYVILLE AND PRECISION CONCRETE CUTTING (PCC)

OVERVIEW

Uneven sidewalks caused by ground settling and tree roots cause a potential hazard to pedestrians. Displaced sidewalks cause problems for both public and private entities in the form of trip and fall liability exposure.

It is proposed that the City of Emeryville and PCC enter into an agreement whereby PCC will assess, and repair sidewalks (horizontal concrete saw cutting) as identified and requested by City staff. The price for these services shall not exceed the dollar amount and quantity defined in the "Proposal Detail" section below.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON PRECISION CONCRETE CUTTING

PROPOSAL DETAILS

Contract amount: Total charge for services rendered shall not exceed \$208,000.

- \$108,000 for repairs outlined in area 1 below and \$100,000 for on-call request through December 31st, 2026.

Sidewalk Repair Billing Units: Services are billed in "Inch Feet". An inch foot is calculated by measuring the average height of the sidewalk off-set and multiplying this average by the length of the cut. Example: A sidewalk off-set on a 4-foot-wide sidewalk that consists of a 0.5" rise on one side, and tapers down to a zero rise on the other is calculated as follows:

$$\frac{0.5" + 0"}{2}$$
 x 4ft = 1 inch-foot

Unit Price for sidewalk shaving: \$45.97 per inch foot
