In addition to the appointed members, each Director may appoint up to 1 alternate member. For Districts 1 and 2, which previously had two 2 appointed members and henceforth shall have 1 appointed member, the Director of each District shall designate one of the two members as appointed member and may designate the non-appointed member as the alternate. If the non-appointed member is not designated as the alternate, his or her membership shall cease. Each Contract Agency shall appoint no more than 1 member as a representative and 1 alternate member unless otherwise specified in the agency's fire and emergency services contract with the Alameda County Fire Department. On October 26, 2010 the Alameda County Board of Supervisors approved and adopted revised Article 5-54 revised by-laws to include "Membership Appointments" on 3/24/15 (#39) the Bylaws were revised. Quorum consists of a simple majority of the number of members appointed.
