









## Grant Funding Opportunities

- ACTC 2024 CIP Call For Projects
  - Application due June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2022
  - 3 smallest cities in county will have no match needed
  - OBAG is in ACTC call along with \$3M TDA and the remainder of VRF and Measure BB
    - OBAG = Federal Funds. Limited resources to manage.



## Other Funding Opportunities in 2022

- Active Transportation
   Program (ATP-Cycle 6):
  - Emeryville successful at regional level in past years (Greenway Crossings and 40<sup>th</sup> Street Re-design)
    - State funds are increasingly competitive, but MTC ATP regional grant also in play
  - All Applications due June 15, 2022
    - State, Regional, Quick-Build





## Recommended City Council Actions

- Ask for City Council to prioritize and rank upcoming projects
  - o The recommended Prioritized Projects and ranked order is as follows:
    - 1) Emery Go-Round Operating Expenses (FY2023-FY2027)
    - 2) Quick-Build Category: Village Greens and Greenways Doyle Street (Phase 3)
    - 3) Shellmound/Christie One-Way Loop Study
    - 4) Stanford Corridor Enhancement Study
    - 5) 40th Street Transit-Only Lanes and Multimodal Enhancements
- Authorize the City Manager to submit applications in response to the California Transportation Commission's (CTC) ATP Cycle 6 Call-for-Projects, Alameda County Transportation Commission's (ACTC) CTP 2024 Call For Projects, and any other grant opportunities that arise in Fiscal Years 2022-2024
- Additionally, staff recommends that the City Council authorizes the Mayor to write letters of support for Prioritized Projects
