**SUBJECT:** Study Session - Emeryville Police Department's Use of Drones

#### RECOMMENDATION

This item offers the City Council the opportunity to discuss and provide direction to staff on the proposed use of drones by the Emeryville Police Department (Police Department) and whether to amend the City's Military Equipment Ordinance to authorize use.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Effective January 1, 2022, Assembly Bill 481 (codified in Government Code Section 7070, et seq.) requires legislative bodies to adopt ordinances approving military equipment policies before law enforcement agencies can continue to engage in specific activities related to the use of what the State Legislature has defined as "military equipment" in Government Code Section 7070. The Police Department's Military Equipment Police was introduced and first read on July 19, 2022, and passed and adopted by the City Council by Ordinance No. 22-006, on September 6, 2022.

In addition, the Emeryville Police Department's existing Policy 606 establishes guidelines for the use of an unmanned aerial system (UAS) and for the storage, retrieval and dissemination of images and data captured by UAS. Any use of drones by the Police Department would be governed by Policy 606.
