Persons who wish to speak on matters set for PUBLIC HEARINGS will be heard when the Presiding Officer calls for comments from those persons who are in support of or in opposition thereto. After persons have spoken, the Hearing is closed and brought back to Council level for discussion and action. There is no further comment permitted from the audience unless requested by the Council.

The speaker's time is limited to 3 minutes and can only be extended upon approval of the Presiding Officer. Any person who desires to address the City Council on any item listed on the Agenda under the Consent Calendar, or on a matter not on the Agenda which item is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the City Council, may do so during that portion of the Agenda called Public Comment.

In compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, a person requiring an accommodation, auxiliary aid, or service to participate in this meeting should contact the City Clerk's Office or ADA Coordinator at (510) 596-4300, as far in advance as possible but no later than 72 hours before the scheduled event. The best effort to fulfill the request will be made.  - (a) Reconsideration of Marketplace Redevelopment Project, "Parcel B".__Reconsideration of a new Final Development Plan (FDP) for "Parcel B" of the Marketplace Redevelopment Project Planned Unit Development (PUD04-12) and rescinding of Final Development Plan FDP15-001 that was approved by the Planning Commission on June 23, 2016. The previously approved FDP included 26,000 square feet of retail space and 300 parking spaces. The proposed FDP includes 14,000 square feet of retail space, 150,000 square feet of office/lab space, and 565 parking spaces. (Project previously approved by Planning Commission on January 24, 2019, appealed to City Council on February 8, 2019, and remanded to Planning Commission by City Council on March 19, 2019.)*

 - proposed (c) Capital Improvement Program. Review of the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Years 2019-20 through 2023-24, for consistency with the Emeryville General Plan pursuant California Government Code to Section 65403(c).**
