RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EMERYVILLE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SUBMIT APPLICATIONS IN RESPONSE TO THE ALAMEDA COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION'S CALL FOR PROJECT NOMINATIONS FOR ITS 2018 COMPREHENSIVE INVESTMENT PLAN

WHEREAS, on August 29, 2016 the Alameda County Transportation Commission ("Alameda CTC") issued a call for project nominations for its 2018 Comprehensive Investment Plan ("2018 CIP"); and

WHEREAS, the 2018 CIP will program funding anticipated for fiscal years 2017-18 through 2021-22 and applications for funding must be consistent with the Countywide Transportation Plan ("CTP"); and

WHEREAS, Alameda CTC has requested that eligible applicants with projects that are implementation-ready for fiscal years 2017-18 through 2021-22 apply for funding through the 2018 CIP; and

WHEREAS, the CTP includes the following Emeryville projects that meet the eligibility and project readiness requirements of the 2018 CIP (the "Recommended Projects"):

- 1. Emery Go Round (EGR) Operating Expenses
- Door-to-Door Shuttle Service "8 To Go"
- 3. Miscellaneous Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements, which includes:
 - a. Greenway Safety Crossings
 - b. Frontage Road Bay Trail Upgrades
- 4. North Hollis Paid Parking Program
- 5. Powell Street Bridge Widening
- 6. 40th and San Pablo Avenue Transit Hub: EGR/AC Transit Bus Shelters
- 7. Local Streets and Roads paving on 36th Street and 53rd Street; and

WHEREAS, each of the projects on this list are high priorities for the 2017-2021 Capital Improvement Program or represent ongoing operational needs for transit services; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to submit applications in response to the Alameda County Transportation Commission's Call for Project Nominations for its 2018 Comprehensive Investment Plan for the Recommended Projects; and be further

RESOLVED, that the City Council ranks the applications as follows:

- 1. EGR Operating Expenses \$2.5 million
- 2. Greenway Safety Crossings \$265,000
- 3. 40th and San Pablo Avenue Transit Hub Bus Shelters \$1 million
- 4. North Hollis Paid Parking Program \$1.1 million
- 5. Powell Street Bridge Widening Scoping \$20,000 of a \$5.2 million project

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6. Frontage Road Bay Trail Upgrades – \$200,000
