SUBJECT: Consideration Of Transportation Committee Recommendation For

Approval Of Converting Existing Angled-In On-Street Parking Spaces To Parallel Parking Spaces With Passenger Loading Only Restrictions Between 8:00AM – 9:00AM and 5:00PM – 6:00PM On School Days On The North Side Of 63rd Street At LePort School:

**Exempt Pursuant to CEQA Guideline 15301(c)** 

## **REQUESTED ACTION**

Staff recommends that the City Council consider and approve the Transportation Committee's recommendation to convert four (4) existing angled-in parking spaces to two (2) parallel parking spaces with passenger loading only restrictions between 8:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. on school days on the north side of 63<sup>rd</sup> Street at LePort School (1450 and 1452 63<sup>rd</sup> Street).

## DISCUSSION

On February 26, 2015 the Planning Commission approved UPDR14-004: a conditional use permit for a school at 1450 and 1452 63<sup>rd</sup> Street. Under conditions of approval VI.B.3. and VI.B.4., the applicant was required to develop a Transportation Demand Management (TDM) plan and have a consultant hired by the City at the applicant's expense to peer review the TDM plan and provide a traffic circulation study of the proposed student pick-up/drop-off procedures and facilities. Fehr & Peers was hired to review the TDM plan and assess the student pick-up/drop-off procedures and facilities. As part of this process, Fehr & Peers recommended converting the two existing angled-in parking spaces on the west side of the LePort School driveway to one parallel parking space. This would help reduce queuing lines during peak student pick-up/drop-off times.

After opening in March 2016, LePort school has carefully monitored student pick-ups and drop-offs. Large vehicles (such as delivery trucks) are often parked in the angled-in spaces both to the east and west of the school driveway. These long vehicles parked in angled-in spaces make it difficult for vehicles accessing LePort school to efficiently enter and exit the student pick-up/drop-off zone, and create a safety hazard as they decrease visibility for surrounding vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists. Restricting the new parallel parking spaces to passenger only loading zones between 8:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. on school days would help prevent congestion during peak student pick-up/drop-off time.

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This action would result in the loss of 2 on-street vehicular parking spaces on the north side of 63<sup>rd</sup> Street and restricted parking between 8:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. on school days. This action is exempt pursuant to CEQA Guideline 15301(c) because it involves a minor alteration to an existing public facility (on-street parking).

## ADVISORY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

At the November 17, 2016 Joint Meeting of the Emeryville Public Works Committee and Transportation Committee, the Committee recommended approval of the requested changes to these on-street parking spaces.
