This past Spring, I gave a presentation at the Senior Center, Emeryville, for a day conference of the NCSS on how Media affects our Perception of Aging. While sitting on the SCCC in Roanoke, I helped to create a booklet for employers to use in order to better provide for employees who were taking care of aging and elderly parents. With the help of the Senior Center and Kim Burrowes in Emeryville, I put on a transportation workshop this past June which was very well attended by the public and well represented by the transportation community; I volunteer for Meals on Wheels

## Why are you interested in serving on this Board, Commission or Committee?

I am interested in serving on this Board not only because I am now a senior who will be moving into that area where I may find myself feeling less and less comfortable relying on my own wheels to get around, but also because I have a very deep wish to make public transportation easily accessed by the aging as well as the disabled communities. Mobility and independence are crucial for continued well-being into the "twilight years" as well as for those who are disabled.
