Resolution Of The City Council Of The City Of Emeryville Designating The Month Of March As Women's History Month In Emeryville

WHEREAS, American women of every race, class, and ethnic background have made historic contributions to the growth and strength of our Nation in countless recorded and unrecorded ways; and

WHEREAS, American women have played and continue to play critical economic, cultural, and social roles in every sphere of the life of the Nation by constituting a significant portion of the labor force, working inside and outside of the home, despite being remunerated at a lower rate than their counterparts; and

WHEREAS, American women of every race, class, and ethnic background served as early leaders in the forefront of every major progressive social change movement and the majority of the volunteer labor force of the Nation; and

WHEREAS, American women have been leaders, not only in securing their own rights of suffrage and equal opportunity, but also in the abolitionist movement, the emancipation movement, the industrial labor movement, the civil rights movement, and other movements, especially the peace movement, which create a fairer and more just society for all; and



WHEREAS, despite these contributions, the role of American women in history has been consistently overlooked and undervalued, in the literature, teaching and study of American history; now, therefore, be it


RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Emeryville does hereby designate the month of March as "Women's History Month."
