## City of Emeryville Homelessness Strategy Last Updated May 2018

## Introduction

In February 2015, the Emeryville City Council passed Resolution 15-10 to adopt a Homeless Strategy. The purpose behind adopting the Homeless Strategy was to Implement the four major goals identified in the City of Emeryville 2015-2023 General Plan: Housing Element. Those four goals include:

- Prevent those currently housed from becoming homeless
- Assist those who are homeless
- Collaborate across sectors and systems
- Support housing for individuals who are experiencing homelessness

The Homeless Strategy was updated again in May 2018 as described below to further revise the strategy to provide concrete actions based on best practices and policies.
