Resolution of The City Council of The City of Emeryville to Approve Acceptance Of The \$33,488 Grant Funds Awarded By The California Department of Justice (DOJ) Proposition 56 Tobacco Law Enforcement Grant Program For A Tobacco Education And Enforcement Campaign To Reduce The Sales Of Tobacco Products To Minors

WHEREAS, the Emeryville Police Department applied for a grant and was funded by the California DOJ, Tobacco Law Enforcement Grant Program to assist in increasing community safety and reducing the number of retail establishment sales of tobacco products to minors within the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the importance of increasing the resources and staff time to improving the safety of the community by reducing the incidents of sales of tobacco products to minors and conducting compliance checks at tobacco retail establishments within the City cannot be overstated; and

**WHEREAS**, the public funding available has shown to help law enforcement agencies devote more staff time to education and enforcement in the area of preventing minors from purchasing and using tobacco products; and

**WHEREAS**, if accepted, the Police Department will utilize the grant funding to continue its education and enforcement of tobacco related offenses in a concerted effort to improve the overall safety and quality of life of the Emeryville community, now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the City Council of the City of Emeryville approves the Police Department accepting the grant funding from the California DOJ, law enforcement Tobacco Grant Program in the amount of \$33,488.
