Resolution Of The City Council Of The City Of Emeryville Approving The Request To The Metropolitan Transportation Commission By The City Of Emeryville For An Allocation Of Transportation Development Act Article 3 Pedestrian And Bicycle Project Funding For Fiscal Year 2018/2019; CEQA Determination: Exempt Pursuant to 15301(c)

WHEREAS, Article 3 of the Transportation Development Act (TDA), Public Utilities Code (PUC) Section 99200 et seq., authorizes the submission of claims to a regional transportation planning agency for the funding of projects exclusively for the benefit and/or use of pedestrians and bicyclists; and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), as the regional transportation planning agency for the San Francisco Bay region, has adopted MTC Resolution No.4108, entitled "Transportation Development Act, Article 3, Pedestrian and Bicycle Projects," which delineates procedures and criteria for submission of requests for the allocation of "TDA Article 3" funding; and

WHEREAS, MTC Resolution No. 4108 requires that requests for the allocation of TDA Article 3 funding be submitted as part of a single, countywide coordinated claim from each county in the San Francisco Bay region; and

WHEREAS, the City of Emeryville desires to submit a request to MTC for the allocation of TDA Article 3 funds to support the projects described in Attachment B to this resolution, which are for the exclusive benefit and/or use of pedestrians and/or bicyclists; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Emeryville finds that the proposed project is exempt under California Environmental Quality Act Guideline 15301(c) which applies to minor alterations to existing public facilities; and, be it further

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Emeryville makes findings in Attachment A, based on the discussion in the City Staff Report dated July 10, 2018; and, be it further

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Emeryville authorizes the City Manager to submit an application (Attachment B) to the County of Alameda and/or MTC and that a certified copy of this resolution and its attachments, and any accompanying supporting materials shall be forwarded to the congestion management agency, countywide transportation planning agency, or county association of governments, as the case may be, of County of Alameda for submission to MTC as part of the countywide coordinated TDA Article 3 claim.
