

RESOLUTION NO. 18-97

Resolution Of The City Council Of The City of Emeryville Calling for the General Municipal Election November 6, 2018; Requesting Approval of Consolidation with the County of Alameda County; Requesting the County Registrar of Voters Perform Certain Election Services in Connection with Said November 6, 2018 Election; and Authorizing the City of Emeryville to Reimburse the County Registrar of Voters for Election Services Performed

WHEREAS, the next statewide General Election will take place on November 6, 2018; and

WHEREAS, in the City of Emeryville, General Municipal Elections are held in November of even numbered years;

WHEREAS, the City of Emeryville will hold a Regular General Municipal Election on Tuesday, November 6, 2018 for the election of two at-large seats, at large, each for a full four-year term currently held by Scott Donahue and Dianne Martinez; and

WHEREAS, Section 10002 of the Elections Code of the State of California provides that the governing body of a City may by resolution request the Board of Supervisors of the County to permit the County elections official to render special services to the City relating to the conduct of elections; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council of the City of Emeryville that the Alameda County Elections Department be permitted to render specified services to the City of Emeryville relating to its conduct of the November 6, 2018 election and consolidate said election being held by other jurisdictions within the City of Emeryville on November 6, 2018; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of Emeryville, California, on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, a general election for the purpose of electing two members of the City Council of the City of Emeryville for the full term of four years; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Emeryville hereby requests the Board of Supervisors of the County of Alameda to consolidate the Municipal Election and the Statewide General Election on November 6, 2018 which may be held in whole or in part of the territory of the City of Emeryville as provided in Elections Code Sections 10400, 10402 and 10403; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, pursuant to Section 10002 of the Elections Code of the State of California, the City of Emeryville hereby requests the Alameda County Board of Supervisors to permit the Alameda County Elections Department to render to the City of Emeryville the services relating to the conduct of the General Municipal Election of November 6, 2018, and to consolidate said election with other elections being held by other jurisdictions within the City of Emeryville; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the City Clerk of the City of Emeryville is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this resolution to the Alameda County Board of Supervisors and upon notification of the granting of such permission, supply the County Elections Department with any and all other information that may be necessary in connection with the conduct of said election; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, for and in consideration of the election services to be rendered by the Alameda County Elections Department, the City of Emeryville agrees to pay to Alameda County the City's proportionate share of the reasonable expenses of said election, said share to consist of all expenses directly related to the conduct of the City of Emeryville's Municipal Election and also the City of Emeryville's proportionate share of expense for election services rendered by Alameda County that are being shared equally with other jurisdictions, if any, in the City of Emeryville on November 6, 2018; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Emeryville will bear the costs for all candidates related to the publication of the Candidate's Statement pursuant to Emeryville Resolution 99-90. The limitation on the number of words that a candidate may use in his/her Candidate's Statement of Qualification is 200 words;


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, in the event a tie vote has been determined and certified by the County Elections Department, a successful candidate will be chosen by lot certification of the election results.
