Resolution Of The City Council Of The City Of Emeryville Accepting Certification of The Results Of A Full Check Of Signatures On A Referendum Petition As Performed By The Alameda County Registrar Of Voters Using Official Voter Registration Records

WHEREAS, on May 21, 2019, the City Council approved the first reading and introduction of Ordinance No. 19-007 (the "Ordinance") to amend Chapter 37 of Title 5 of the Emeryville Municipal Code, "Minimum Wage, Paid Sick Leave, and Other Employment Standards"; and

WHEREAS, the Ordinance was subsequently adopted by the City Council after its second reading on May 29, 2019 and attested by the City Clerk on May 30, 2019; and

WHEREAS, following adoption of the Ordinance, a referendum petition against the ordinance was circulated and submitted to the City Clerk on June 25, 2019; and

WHEREAS, in order to meet the requirements of California Elections Code §9237, the petition must be signed by not less than 10% of the registered voters of the City, according to the Alameda County Registrar of Voters' ("Registrar") last official report of registration and be submitted within 30 days of the date the ordinance in question is attested by the City Clerk; and

WHEREAS, for the City of Emeryville, that number, reported by the Registrar as of the drafting of this resolution, was 6,653, of which 666 signatures constitute 10%; and

WHEREAS, the referendum petition was timely submitted within 30 days of attestation of the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, following a prima facie review of signatures by the City Clerk, the Registrar performed a full check of signatures as compared to the official records of voter registration; and

WHEREAS, the Registrar, having compared the petition signatures to the official records of voter registration, certified on (<u>Insert Date</u>), a full, true and correct (<u>Insert Title of Registrar Statement</u>), attached hereto as Exhibit A; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code §§ 9237, 9240, and 9114, the City Clerk as the City's Elections Official hereby certifies that the petition proponent has gathered enough signatures on the referendum petition to require Council to reconsider the Ordinance and thereafter to either repeal the Ordinance in its entirety, or to place the Ordinance on the ballot for a vote of the people; now, therefore be it
