I'm currently a Realtor, having worked in the East Bay for over seventeen years. I'm currently at Marvin Gardens in Kensington. While in high school, and as my first job in Berkeley I worked in bicycle shops. I've done a lot of bike commuting in the past, and try to go to my office up in Kensington at least once a week on my bike. This does prove to be difficult, what with needing a car to show houses. My highest educational level is a B.A. in Great Books from the University of Notre Dame in 1978.
