SUBJECT: Policing Policies Study Session--Emeryville Police Department Presentation

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council conduct a Study Session to discuss Policing Policies in Emeryville and identify topics for future policy development and discussion.

BACKGROUND

Following the killing of George Floyd in Minneapolis in May, the City Council requested a Study Session to enable the Council to discuss various issues surrounding policing policies in Emeryville. Interim Police Chief Robert Schreeder joined the City on June 16, 2020 and since that time has been working with his staff to develop information to present to the City Council.

DISCUSSION

The Chief and members of the Emeryville Police Department will present information on the following topics at the Study Session:

1. Overview of the Emeryville Police Department
2. Review of Calls for Service
3. Use of Force: policy, types of authorized force, training, reporting and data
4. Personnel Complaints: process, review and data
5. Mutual Aid process
6. Suggested next steps for further policy development

FISCAL IMPACT
