1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting convened via teleconference at 7:20 p.m. The Mayor read aloud a statement announcing that the meeting was being conducted by teleconference pursuant to the Brown Act waivers provided for under the Governor's Executive Order in response to the COVID-19 State of Emergency.

5. ANNOUNCEMENT OF COMMISSION / COMMITTEE VACANCIES

No announcement was made.

6. COUNCIL MEMBER SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS / REPORTS ON MEETING ATTENDANCE

Council Member Bauters reported on his attendance of the ACTC meeting, stating that a proposal to amend the Transportation Expenditure Plan for 2014 (Measure BB) had been discussed, and that the Committee recommended removing the BART to Livermore expenditure and replacing it with the Valley Link proposal, to include amendments the Council Member added. He said that the matter would be voted on at September 24th and that a super-majority vote was needed.

Council Member Medina reported that she and Council Member Bauters had both attended the ACTC Interagency Liaison Committee Meeting, and that the San Pablo corridor redesign pilot would move forward for Emeryville and Oakland.

Vice Mayor Martinez reported on her attendance of the Fire Advisory Committee meeting, stating that the new Fire Chief had been introduced, and that there would be discussion on including diversity, equity and inclusion in recruitment and hiring practices going forward in the Fire Service. She also asked that the meeting be adjourned in memory of longtime former Council Member Nora Davis and added that she had requested that the Commission on Aging brainstorm ways that the City could honor Council Member Davis.

Mayor Patz provided highlights on Council Member Davis' long tenure on the Council, and asked Community Development Director Charles Bryant to share some thoughts about her. Both the Vice Mayor and Council Member Donahue added their comments as well. The Mayor announced his attendance at the Mayors' Conference, where the topic of Halloween was discussed. He also attended the HACA meeting where a stagnant non-profit was disbanded. He concluded by announcing the upcoming Celebration of the Arts.
