She also reported on her attendance, along with Council Member Bauters, of the AC Transit meeting where a discussion ensued regarding the San Pablo Avenue corridor redesign pilot, and stated that the program could result into protected bike lanes to be under construction in Emeryville in 2023.

Council Member Bauters reported that the City, in partnership with CalTrans, AC Transit and ACTC regarding the Bay Bridge Forward plan which will be moving forward with an opportunity to redesign the south entrance to 580/I-80 to a bus-only/HOV lane.

Mayor Martinez reported on having participated in a recent CAL-OES call where the arrival of COVID-19 vaccine doses were announced, with more coming by Christmas. She added that there was an app available to community members that would provide the ability to be alerted to contract tracing and that they could sign up for by visiting CANotify.ca.gov.
