## **RESOLUTION NO. 21-50**

Resolution Of The City Council Of The City Of Emeryville Approving The Proposed SB 1 Project List And Appropriation For Fiscal Year 2021/2022

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), Road Repair and Accountability Act (RRAA) of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by legislature and signed into law by the Governor in April of 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our city are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the City must include a list of all projects proposed to receive funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, in the City budget, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

**WHEREAS**, the City will receive an estimated \$232,289 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2021-22 from SB 1; and

**WHEREAS**, this is the fourth year in which the City is receiving SB 1 funding and will enable the City to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities/the project list; and

**WHEREAS**, the funding from SB 1 will help the City maintain and rehabilitate maintain and rehabilitate streets/roads/pedestrian infrastructure and add active transportation infrastructure throughout the City this year and many similar projects into the future; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2018 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the City's streets and roads are in a good condition and this revenue will help the City to increase the overall quality of our road system and over the next decade will bring our streets and roads into a "excellent" condition; and

**WHEREAS**, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, by the City Council of the City of Emeryville as follows:
