I currently work with BRIDGE Housing, a San Francisco-based nonprofit owner developer and manager of affordable housing. As part of the acquisitions and planning team, I source and act on acquisition and development opportunities for BRIDGE throughout California and the Pacific Northwest. Most recently, I led BRIDGE's acquisition of 1740 San Pablo Avenue for a 51 unit project serving low-income households, including initial due diligence (geotechnical, survey, environmental, title) and applying for City of Berkeley funding. Prior to joining BRIDGE, I served as a consultant to cities, transit agencies, and private developers and led predevelopment for 30+ projects across North America. My core expertise is in public-private partnerships, including deal structuring, RFQ/Ps, term sheets, redevelopment agreements, and negotiations between private developers and public agencies. Outside of work, I enjoy exploring the East Bay by bike and am a volunteer tutor for 826 Valencia and admissions ambassador for Cornell University.

Why are you interested in serving on this Board, Commission or Committee?

Housing is a human right and one of the most challenging issues facing the Bay Area today. Emeryville has made significant progress on this issue, with projects such as the Ambassador, 3706 San Pablo and 3600 San Pablo making a positive contribution to the ongoing housing crisis. However, as evident by long waitlists and the growing issue of homelessness, we must clearly do more as a City. With the approval of the \$50 million Measure C Housing Bond in 2018 in addition to \$14.5 million in impact fees, County A1 funds, and other resources that can be invested in the next 2-3 years, the City is at a pivotal moment and needs to develop informed housing policies guided by the needs of our housed and unhoused residents, market realities and on the ground development experience. As a nonprofit affordable housing developer, I have experienced firsthand the structural barriers to developing affordable housing ranging from rising construction costs, lengthy entitlement processes, lack of public funding, amongst other issues. Even the most noncontroversial projects with full support of neighbors and the local jurisdiction can take anywhere from 2-5 years before construction can begin due to the highly competitive nature of gap funding at the State level. The City can and must do more with the limited resources within its control, including Measure C funds and the Christie Ave surplus sites. With almost a decade of experience in housing development and policy. I am confident I can bolster the diverse perspectives on the Housing Committee and support Emeryville as it works with nonprofits, private developers, landowners, State agencies and others to provide more housing to those in need.
