

RESOLUTION NO. 21-90**Resolution of the City Council Authorizing the City Manager to Accept a Grant Award on Behalf of the Police Department, From the FY2019 State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP) in the amount of \$16,500 For Funds Related to a Ballistic Shields and a RADAR System.**

WHEREAS, the Emeryville Police Department applied for and was awarded grant funding from the State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP) to purchase a patrol vehicle mounted RADAR system and four ballistic shields; and

WHEREAS the ballistic shields will increase officer safety, protect police department staff, and provide officers with the ability to deescalate potentially dangerous incidents without using force, to help emergency services personnel maintain public order, to help manage emergency response situations; and

WHEREAS, vehicle mounted RADAR systems are used by officers to conduct vehicle speed enforcement, to increase the safety of pedestrians, bicyclists, and other motor vehicle occupants; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department currently has two ballistic shields that are fifteen and ten years old respectively, and need replacement and the Department does not have any RADAR speed enforcement systems, which will provide more opportunities for officers to respond to community complaints about speeding motorists, be it

RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Emeryville approves the Police Department accepting the grant funding award by the FY2019 State Homeland Security Grant Program, for monies in the amount of \$16,500; and, that the funds be deposited into Grant Fund 254 and appropriated to spend in the same fund, and be it, further

I. F. Description - Briefly describe exactly what the project entails, the terrorism nexus and what would be accomplished by funding the project.

The Emeryville Police Department is requesting funding through the SHSGP FY19 grant program for a ballistic shield and a patrol vehicle dash mounted RADAR system. We know that when used and deployed effectively, ballistic shields can protect officers and innocent community members from firearms. Additionally, patrol mounted RADAR system can help officers in increasing community safety from speeding motorists. Both these items will benefit the community and officers by reducing dangerous behavior in our communities.

The proposal is for the purchase of these items will help EPD prevent and respond to criminal activity. The nexus to increased safety from the prevention aspect is to respond to complaints and conduct enforcement of speeding vehicles. While most driver's who speed are not involved in other nefarious activity, it can be inferred that some terrorist activity could involve a speeding driver.

Law enforcement ballistic shields have proven to increase officer safety when responding to any incident involving the use of a firearm, including any incident that may have a nexus to terrorism. Ballistic shields in some of the patrol vehicles can also assist officers in other jurisdictions and operational areas.

Law enforcement equipment identified in this proposal will have a direct impact to safety to our community and to the officers. Systems like these have also had a positive impact during large events such as civil unrest and large looting criminal activities, and the prevention of dangerous driving in the community.

This equipment will have the ability to make our communities in this Operational Area safer by both deterring crime and / or responding to violent criminal activity in progress. This request is for funding from the SHSGP for four ballistic shields and one vehicle mounted RADAR system.
