Council Member Martinez reported that East Bay Community Energy had saved Alameda County customers \$3M in first 6 months of the fiscal year, and provided EBCE contact information for billing questions. She also explained the purpose and goals of Stop Waste, and some of its upcoming initiatives. Council Member Bauters reported on a recently posted Caltrans Notice of Intent to perform construction on the MacArthur maze, stating that the impacts it would have on Emeryville street traffic would be immense. He also gave an update on a recent monetary judgement the County has received meant to support efforts toward lead poisoning abatement, stating that the funding had a deadline for use and that certification trainings need to be added so the work can be accomplished in time. He concluded by reporting that the Air District was planning its budget, and that Alameda County contributed more than its share toward funding. Vice Mayor Patz expressed appreciation to staff for the recent well-attended Community Services Committee meeting. Mayor Medina reported that the Alameda County Mayors' Conference was looking into amending terms of service of its regional appointments for cities with rotating one-year mayorships.
