Council discussion ensued, with general agreement being reached that a Countywide approach be taken, and providing input on a model ordinance for Vice Mayor Martinez to take back to Stop Waste.

13. DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Director Bryant gave the Planning Director's report.

City Manager Daniel, in her capacity as the Interim Public Works Director, reported that a notice to proceed had been issued for the South Bayfront Bridge project, anticipating a January 2020 start date. Regarding the Ashby interchange, she reported that the City had met with ACTC and agreed to reduce the study alternatives from six to three. She stated that staff's preferred design was the so-called "tight diamond" and that alternatives 4, 5 and 6 as options still in the running, with 1, 2 and 3 no longer being considered. She added that consideration of a contract for tree trimming would come forward to the Council at its January 21, 2020 meeting.

- **13.1.** <u>ID-2019-608</u> Planning Director's report on Planning Commission actions at the December 12, 2019 meeting:
 - (a) Marketplace Redevelopment Project, "Parcel B". Referral from the City Council for a report on an alternative proposal for a Development Plan (FDP) for "Parcel B" the Marketplace Redevelopment Project Planned Unit Development. The proposal is an alternative to the design approved by the Planning Commission on May 14, 2019. The proposed alternative FDP includes 15,700 square feet of retail space, 150,000 square feet of office/lab space, and parking spaces. The Commission will make a recommendation to the City Council.
 - (b) Hilton Garden Inn Appeal. Consideration of an appeal of the Community Development Director's approval of Conditional Use Permit to convert existing storage and meeting rooms on the top floor of an existing hotel at 1800 Powell Street into 23 new guest rooms and to convert storage on the second floor into two new guest rooms. Pursuant to Planning Regulations Section 9-7.1404(b), the Planning Commission may either (1) affirm the decision of the Director and dismiss appeal а determination that the based on ascertainable from the record do not warrant further hearing; (2) set a date for a public hearing on the appeal; or (3) remand the matter to the Director to cure a deficiency in the record or the proceedings.

(c) BMR Emeryville Center of Innovation. Study Session to review a proposal for a Final Development Plan to construct two new multi-tenant research and development buildings and a supporting parking garage as part of implementation of the Emeryville Life Sciences Center Planned Unit Development/Preliminary Development Plan (PUD/PDP), also referred to as the "Chiron PUD/PDP", that was approved by the City Council on August 15, 1995.
